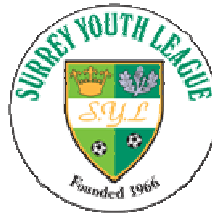



5. **Chairman's Report**

Welcome to the Leagues AGM for the season 2014/15 – the League's 49th Year of existence, and the end of my 6th Year as Chairman. As those familiar to the Surrey Youth League know that I try to give a look at what we have achieved and what we as League and also my own personal perspective of what lays ahead in the coming year.

We now find ourselves days away from the world cup – where are our expectations, what are we expecting from our country. I sense that at the moment maybe the expectation has been managed particularly well by Roy Hodgson and the Media guru's at the FA.

Expectation perhaps is something everyone in the room tonight can reflect upon as we move forward

The Surrey Youth League Operation

I get the feeling that for the last few years my report is more suited to the run down on the previous year's weather experience, this year being no exception. We all know how it didn't stop raining for 6-8 weeks and how football just didn't happen. Once again the resilience of everyone in the league go us through and the season glided to a conclusion, perhaps a few too many awarded games this year, but I think that was the late Easter that contributed to that as well.

I must now move on to your committee – a huge thank you to everyone, all of them very special people with whom most have their own clubs to run, but also find time to administer the running of the league. All of the events – Finals, Presentation Day, Meetings all take an enormous amount of time and dedication, of which I give thanks to all those who organise and help.

We have solid finances, we believe our fees are fair, and for the 4th year now there are no increases. We are though a little concerned that the fines rose this year, but on examination the biggest slice of the fines was for late payment, just a ridiculous situation for clubs to get into, just poor administration.

As mentioned last year our Life Vice President – Bill Nash passed away, I am humbled to announce to the league that Bill has left in his will a sum of £5000 for the league to use as it sees fit. Our initial thoughts are that this will be used as some form of Bursary that the initial funds will be used to start up and that we will as a league utilise these funds for the purposes of Education, Development and Respect. Our Plans are as yet not finalised, but we will announce them in the autumn.

Once again I make a special mention to three groups of people within it. Firstly our Fixture secretaries – this last season that navigated the deluge in Dec, Jan & Feb. We achieved nearly 6,000 matches played in this league, with over 735 teams participating.

But also our Referee Management Team – Alan Wiggins, supported ably by Gillian in trying to deliver referees to your matches' week in week out, a truly fantastic role. Scheduling 120 referees weekly is quite honestly the biggest referee allocation role in the whole of Surrey, both adult & youth league and quite probably the south of England, a sincere thank you from me to Alan & Gillian.

Finally our third Team, or Individual, Alan Watson our Registrations Secretary, I think I need say no more than 10,000 children were registered to play in the League, that's 10,000 ID cards issued in the main early and ready for the children to play, just a fantastic effort.

We have a strong group of people that run the league from Finances, League Administration to Cup Final and Presentation day organisation, we are always looking for more people to join, and this year again we need to strengthen the Fixture Secretary area, two volunteers will be great.

Recognition.

Last year I mentioned that the league had won many awards during the year and that our Roy & Pam Lomax, our President and wife, were to be nominated for the Life Time Achievement award to for Services to Football, well guess what, they won!!

Presented awards on the pitch at Wembley by Sir Trevor Brooking, a great day for them. That was it, or so they thought, they were asked to reserve a date in their diaries for October. What were Roy & Pam's expectation?, but then it arrived - their invite in the post to "Buckingham Palace" to be part of select group of 150 guests to witness a football match in the palace grounds to celebrate the 150 years of the FA. I know that both Roy and Pam were humbled by this experience. All those years ago when they committed to youth football did they have any notion of it leading to a day at Buckingham Palace, what were those expectations of what they fell into years ago?

The development

Once again the league rolled out new developments in youth football, in line with the national youth review, ably supported by our County FA through Caroline McRoyall and John Burr. This last season saw the introduction of Development Football at the Under 9 age group with small focused Trophy events staged throughout the season.

Along with the U8's, who had more round robin days, the feedback I and Frank received, was that on the whole the Trophy events with development football is much better for the younger children than the season long competitions, It does make it a lot easier for the league to move teams during the season to the right development groups. A few lessons learnt in the areas of adopting a stronger stance with teams to play the trophy events, formal use of the 27 day rule, slightly smaller development groups and a little more regionalisation and the lower end of the development groups will be seen this coming season

No season long competition = breaks from Parental expectations week in week out. We had just one mad man to deal with in a trophy event, so I guess it works, what on earth his expectation was defied belief.

Education - Once again we gave the opportunity for subsidised Level 1 Coaching Courses, Referees and Junior Leaders, all of the courses were oversubscribed. The numbers in the last season were:-

- Mini Refs 104 Places
- Junior Football Leader 192 Places
- Level 1 Coach 72 Places
- Referees Course 25 Places
- 1st Aid 17 Places
- Safeguarding Children 9 Places

Thanks again to Frank for the organisation and Steve Worsley for running the Refereeing Courses. The funding for this arrives through the County FA, and some of own resources, we will do everything we can to plough our monies back into education and pushing for the right environments for youth football. You may also see further developments in the Junior Football Leaders courses, Frank has his usual "mad" idea's that end up working well.

The rules changed last season and the three significant ones of 3G pitches, Multi Team registration in youth football and cup qualification all had a positive effect, working well for youth football.

This season you will see that the daft anomaly of the odd player not being able to play up an age group has been removed, you will see in the rule amendment that any child can play up one year regardless of age group and form of football, I guess the FA do listen. There is also an amendment allowing girls to play in mixed football up to the age of 16. I can't see this being needed in Surrey as there is such a strong girls league, but you have to understand this are standard rules for areas of the country that are quite remote, so numbers for teams are important, but were are obliged to include.

9v9 is well established and for next year development football moves to the U10 age group, lots of small competitions for these and a little knock out cup as well.

Looking forward 820 teams have applied, when the divisional constutions come out you will see that in certain age groups some further divisions have been inserted at the lower ends to accommodate. Please understand that we are just trying to have divisions of equal ability, we have become pretty good at this over recent seasons, hopefully, however there will be some expectations to be managed.

Competitive Football

Whilst we talk much about development, education and respect we cannot get away from pure facts that the Surrey Youth League provides for some of the most competitive football outside of the professional academy system.

The high standard football at the top end was reflected in numerous county cup competitions, virtually a clean sweep of the Surrey cups and an extraordinary performance in the U15's with not just Surrey won, but also Middlesex and London, three different teams winning the pinnacle county competition.

However the Surrey Youth League is so much more than the competitive top 2/3 divisions. Well organised competitive football for all is what the league is about, with 800+ teams in the league 100% growth since I started this role, it cannot be about standard alone.

In the main the divisions were about the correct standards, clearly a league is what it is and some teams will finish at the top and some will finish at the bottom, in three divisions out of about 50 Divisions only 3 or 4 teams were miles out of their standard and generally at the bottom end. I guess from a league perspective not bad, but for those children affected we failed as adults to get them in the correct standard. I implore you all to be realistic about your teams ability, this "They need to be Challenged" statements I get are just adult ego's, I never or rarely hear, they just want to enjoy their football in the middle division.

The desire to achieve is far too much centred on the Adult ego rather than Children Centric. I will this year be very firm in what I believe is correct and I won't be swayed by the strengthening arguments, or the daft ones of if we are not in x division I will lose players.

Respect & Fairplay

The centre of why we do this – The Children, we must ensure that everything we do, we do it for the reasons of the Child enjoyment and not the egos of the adults.

I'll touch on discipline at this point, year after year I point out that matters of on field and near field discipline is handled by the county FA's, leagues have zero powers in handing out punishments for those discipline matters. However we are responsible for ensuring that discipline processes are followed, that education is delivered and that a safe environment exists for the Children to play in.

In the grand scheme of operating 735 teams we had a good season, only two teams ended up carrying out the Respect compliance video's and education before we gave them more fixtures. One team that we had called in previously clearly turned their operation around and were highly praised by opposition for doing so.

We know this works in the medium term, it doesn't though stop teams, or adults should I say, falling out on the day, nor does it stop individuals seeing incidents from myopic perspectives. I had my own experiences of this during the season causing me to reflect on how my view of what happened in two games can be seen so differently from others views, and these were not refereeing decisions by the way!!! There is always 3 sides to a football story!!

Regards fair play marks, this year we called in 3 teams who have been given clear agreed plans on what we expect and we will monitor that these plans have improved the standards as we expect by the end of October, or a lot of inconvenience for these teams will ensue, and little football will be played by the teams involved.

For 735 teams, apart from the odd rumble, respect and fair play was first class.

Furthermore I am pleased to announce that we will be running a scheme whereby further respect barriers can be purchased from an agreement the league has virtually finalised. The monies available for this funding will be £5000, in addition we will be giving to every team a Respect Arm band for the captain.

Respect works, if we keep doing the simple things, barriers, not lines or cones, responsibility of captains, education of managers, parents and clubs – the message gets out there and works, but we mustn't relax.

Summary

Expectations – we commence the coming season full of want and desire, centred, in the main, around success on a football field.

As an organiser of Children’s football, shouldn’t we also be looking at how we are developing the social skills, the interaction skills, and maybe the expectation is that we should use football as a vehicle to develop the children into good people, do we do this, is this at the centre of what we do, or is it still win at all costs regardless of the child impact.

Please manage those expectations, be realistic and make your targets for the children achievable.

So I will end there

But perhaps when it comes to the world cup, maybe we can get carried away with our expectations!!

Prawn Sandwich 2015 – 2016 Configuration & Registration Guidance

Dear Club Secretary

For our existing clubs / secretaries Prawn Sandwich will this season be far simpler configuring for the new season.

For all new clubs or those that need a reminder we will email out the Full Instructions on how to use Prawn Sandwich, shortly after the AGM. This will include Log in information for new club secretaries, or changes of club secretaries.

For Existing Clubs the following will apply.

- 1) Last year's log in info is the same for club secretaries and all their managers and officials.
- 2) From the 9th June 2015 you can start to check and ensure that all your "Staff" information is correct in terms of contact information, email and phone numbers – this year PS will be the primary source of contact details.
- 3) You can also fill in the general club details such as colours, and County FA registration numbers, Charter Status etc.
- 4) Your Teams will be added to Prawn Sandwich by the League, we intend to have this completed by 20th June. You will not be able to add or delete teams this season. If a team withdraws please contact the League General Secretary (Frank Thompson) ASAP.
- 5) Once we have added the teams, we will tell all club secretaries, you can then assign the Managers and Assistants to Teams, instructions are in the Full Instructions that will be emailed out after the AGM.
- 6) You now only have the players to register & configure. Please take note of the following:-
 - a. For Players staying at the same club then you will find the player in your clubs database, just assign the player to the team and tick the "Request Registration" box and "Click to save".
 - b. For all New Players to a club, those joining from inside or from outside of the SYL, you will have to follow the full PS registration process for those players.
- 7) Player Registration on Prawn Sandwich **MUST** be completed before submitting your forms with photographs at the Registration Evenings, failure to do so, may result in your forms being rejected.

It's a year since many of you used the administration area of Prawn Sandwich so please email if in any doubt and we can help, it's far easier to deal with queries than people struggle and get things wrong.
