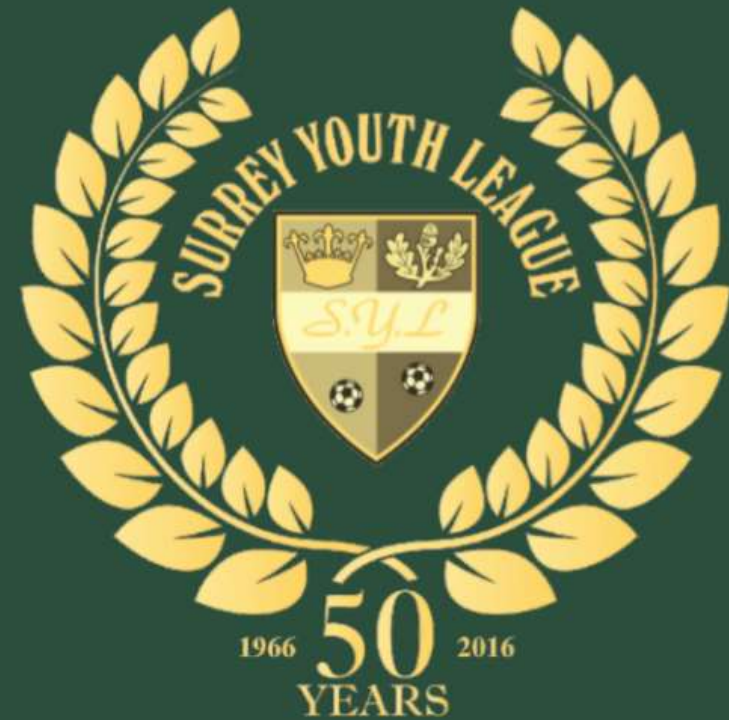

**Play your part and support The FA's Code of Respect:**

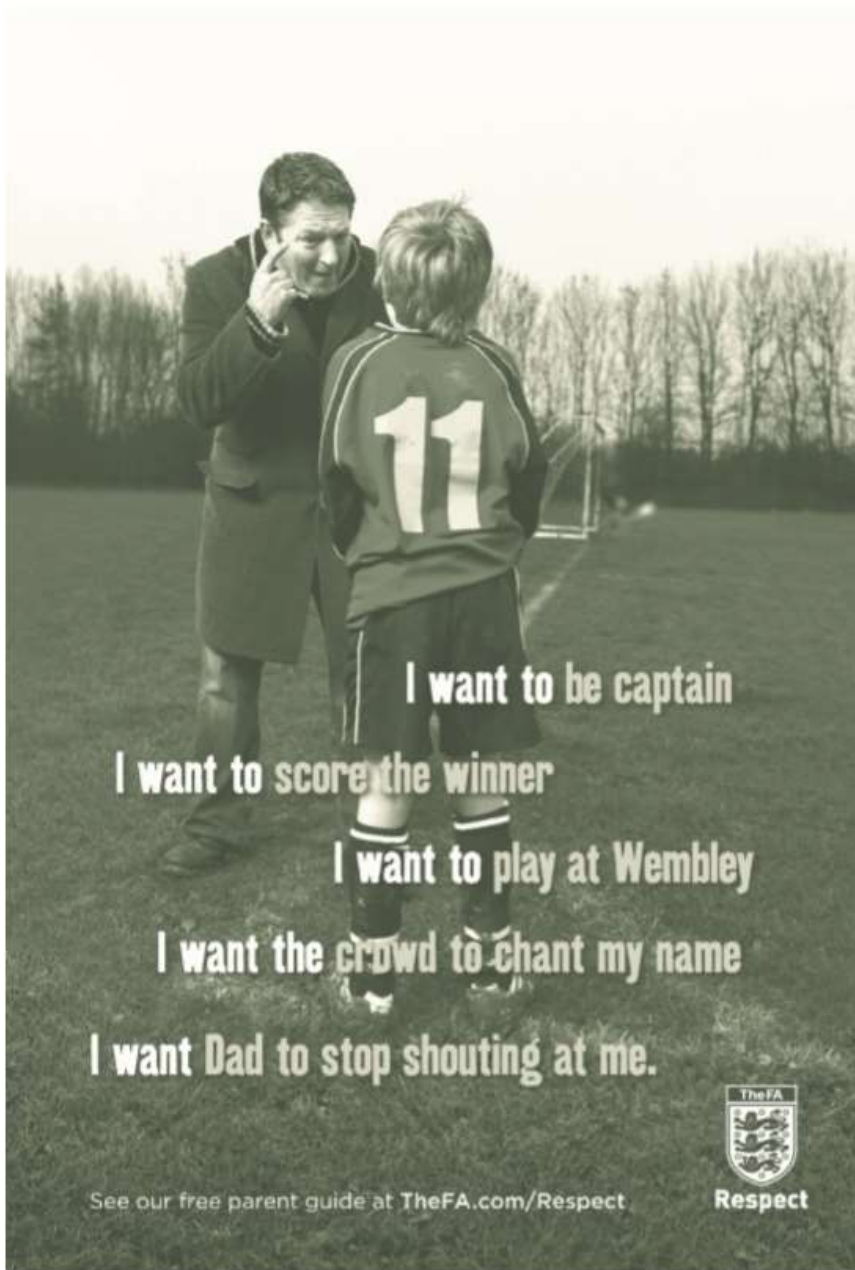
- Have fun; it's what we're all here for!

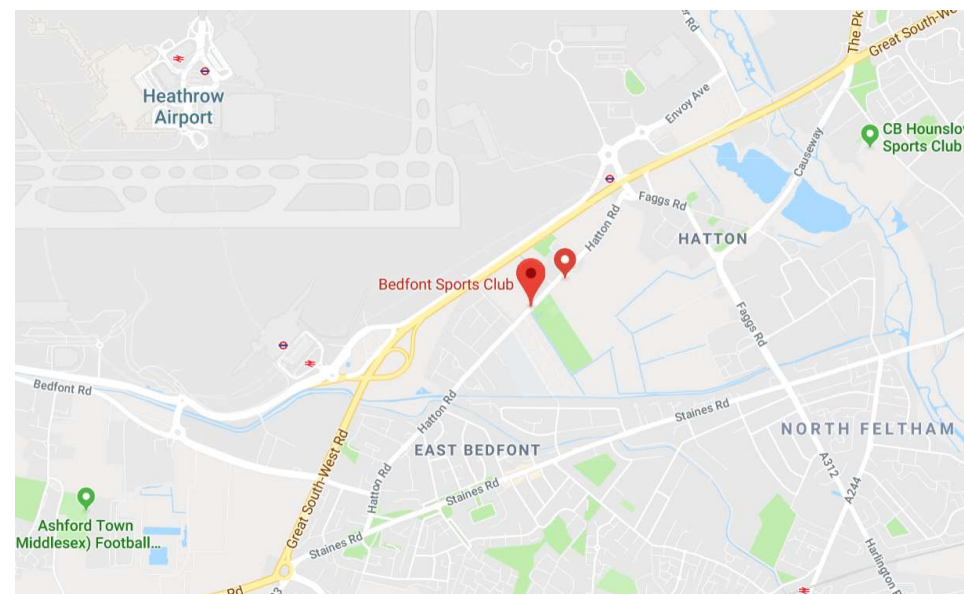
