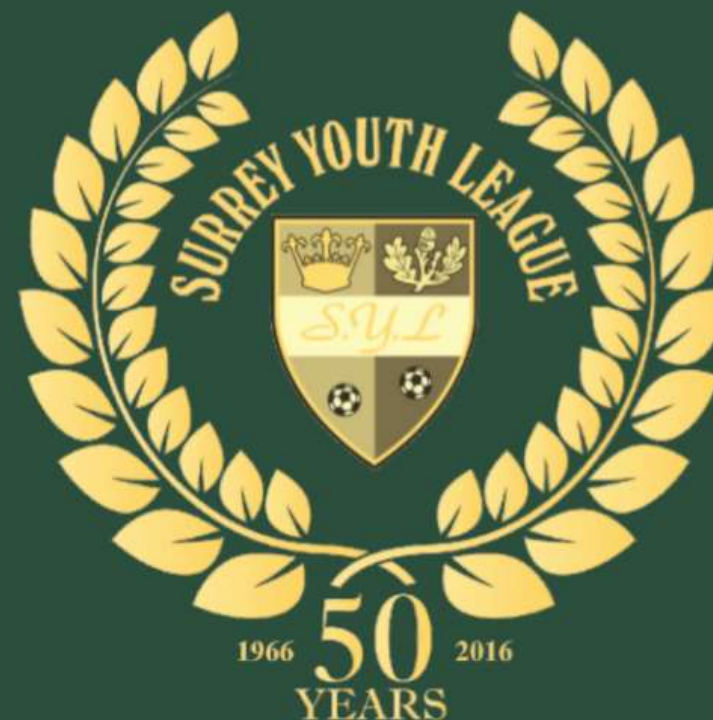

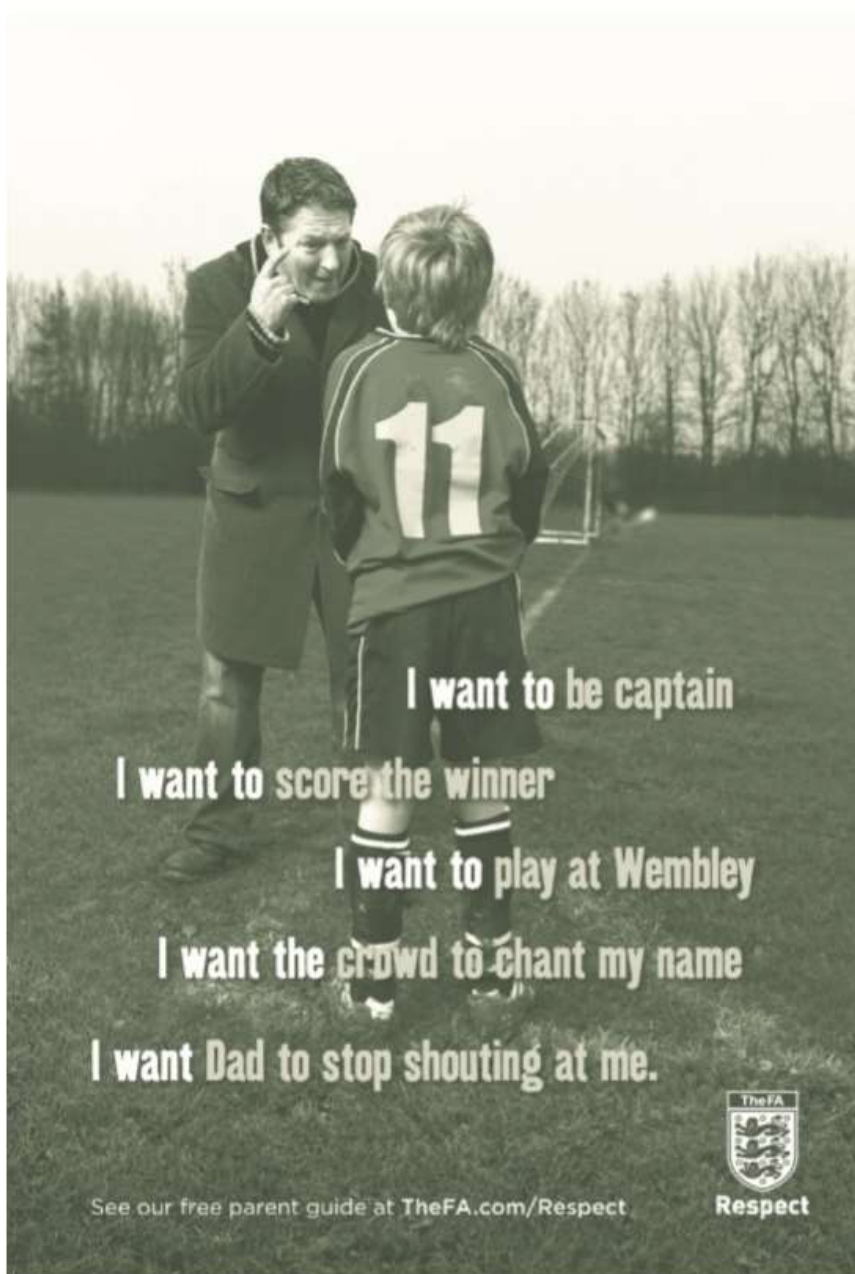
- Have fun; it's what we're all here for!

The next true test then was our Semi Final opponents Sandgate Colts. A team riding high in the Conference with real promotion ambition. The game was incredibly tense and this close encounter witnessed the Knights come back from behind to finish 1 each after full time/extra time. Penalties! Nerves already messy, both sets of supporters pulled away at their scalps to leave little but a patchy semblance. The Knights however took themselves into a deserved final with a mature display from the spot. The Division 1 title secured, the only question remains is can they now do the double.
